On election day all precincts will have a Drop Box for mail-in ballots.


Voters who requested a mail ballot can have the ballot deposited at the precinct

Know what you need to know:

- Election Day General Reminders
- Overview of people and functions
- Persons Allowed/Activities Prohibited



Preparing for Election Day

- Make sure you have marked it on calendar
- Sign up and attend necessary training
- Recommend you vote EARLY even if you are assigned to your precinct
- Double check your alarm clock



Rules and Regulations

- Arrive no later than 5am
- No campaign or political materials (pins, clothing, literature)
- Do not discuss politics on Election Day
- Voters ALWAYS come first
- All officers are required to sign certain tapes, forms and envelopes
- You may not leave the polling place until closing duties are complete





Be Careful of Voters issues


The Chief takes care of all voters who have a problem that you cannot resolve quickly!

The Voting Process





Roles and Responsibilities

- Greeter
- EPB Officer
- Ballot Officer
- Booth Officer
- Scan Officer

Chief Officer
Assistant Chief Officer



Greeter

- Greet the voter
- Ask all voters "Are you here to vote or are you returning a ballot"
- Ask voter to have ID out and ready
 - Voters returning ballots don't have to wait in line or show ID
- Send voter to next available EPB or
- Send voter who is dropping off a mail in ballot to the Drop Box

Drop Box Duties

- Duties at the Drop Box
 - Never leave the Drop Box unattended
 - Take ballot from voter (no questions asked)
 - Remember NO ID required to drop ballot off
 - Drop ballot in box



Step 1: Ask the voter for any one of Virginia's acceptable forms of identification

OR

Step 2: Ask the voter for their full legal name and current residence address!

They can give you that information in writing.

Step 3: Locate voter's name on the pollbook or EPB.



 Step 4: Repeat the voter's full name in a loud and clear tone so that the party and/or candidate representatives can hear.*

*NOTE: As of July 1, 2020, officers shall only state out loud the voter's full name!! No longer state the voter's address out loud!



•Step 5: Compare voter's current address with the address printed on the pollbook or seen on the EPB screen.

Step 6: Check in voter on EPB



•Step 7: Give the voter a ballot. After being checked in on the EPB, the voter must remain in the polling place until they cast their vote.



- 1. Voter confirmation documents
- 2. Virginia Driver's license
- 3. Any other ID card issued by a government agency of the Commonwealth, one of its political subdivision, or the United States



- 4. Student ID card issued by any institution of higher education located in the Commonwealth of Virginia
- 5. Student ID card issued by any institution of higher education located in any other state or territory of the United States
- 6. Student ID card issued by any public or private high school located in Virginia



- 7. Any employee ID card containing a photograph of the voter and issued by an employer of the voter in the ordinary course of the employer's business
- •8. . A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document containing the name and address of the voter



- Note: Unless stated IDs DO NOT have to contain a photograph of the voter.
- Note: Expiration date on Virginia driver's license is not considered, any other form of ID can not be expired longer that 12 months

• A voter is at the EPBs for Check-in. You notice his name on the poll book reads "Matthew Wilson Smith" but his ID reads "Matthew Wilson-Smith." He correctly states his name and address based on what you see in the poll book. You will check the voter in and recommend he fill out a registration application to correct the error.



• If you are unsure if a voter's ID is valid, send the voter to the Chief.

 We are not authorized to ask voters to remove masks or any other head covering





 A woman walks in, hands you her ID, and you look her up. She recites everything correctly EXCEPT her last name. You inform her there is a discrepancy in her last name and inquire as to whether it has changed recently. If she says yes and provides the correct information, check her in. Recommend she fill out a registration application to change her name on the voter rolls.





• A voter walks in and hands you her Virginia driver's license. You notice that the driver's license has an exact match to the poll book regarding her name and address. You then state her name for confirmation purposes and so any observers can hear her information and complete the check in process on the EPB.





- Below is the information you should be concerned about when inspecting a voter's ID.
 - a. Name
 - b.Address
 - c. Expiration. Can be used for one year after it expires
 - a. Except a Virginia Drivers License used for voting DOES NOT expire

Voter Check In

EPB OFFICER



"Gone" in 30 seconds...

- Voter should have ID ready Greeter to remind voters
- Scan if Virginia Driver's License
- If voter presents ID other than DL do not waste more time getting a DL





EPB OFFICER

- Obtain Voter ID. If the Voter has NO acceptable ID
- Have Voter complete ID Confirmation Statement
- If Voter chooses not to complete statement send them to the Chief






EPB OFFICER

- Look up Voter in EPB
 - Either scan the Voter's VA Drivers License or start typing the Voter's last name 3.3 Tip (e.g. First 3 letters Last name Comma First 3 Letters First Name)

Example: Tommy Dorsey – DOR,TOM





EPB OFFICER

- Beware of spelling anomalies like O'HARA vs. OHARA
- •Display the Voter Details screen by clicking on the Voter Name from the list screen, if you scanned the Voter's ID the Voter Details screen will open automatically.
- •If the wrong Voter Details screen opens, click "Back to List".





Voter Details Screen





•To qualify the Voter, verify the voter's ID info, and what appears on the EPB screen.

USE THE ADDRESS AS STATED OR WRITTEN BY VOTER TO VERIFY ADDRESS

•IF THE VOTER'S NAME AND ADDRESS INFORMATION IS CORRECT,

STATE NAME ONLY BACK TO VOTER SO OBSERVERS CAN HEAR.

We no longer state VOTERS address

 Verify the Election District Information to determine which ballot to give the voter (if necessary).





Next Voter in Line, Please!



 * If you feel that the VOTER was not Checked-In correctly you can VERIFY by one of 2 steps listed:

1.Rescan the Photo ID – Red Exclamation point displayed in voter messages section indicates voter has been checked in (example below).



Repeat manual search and if name appears highlighted RED on list, it means that voter has been checked in (example below).




 Reminder to polling places with two ballots (splits): Ensure the voter receives the correct ballot!







Election Day Voter Messages (NOV2021)

Name	Message	Flag
Issued	Does the voter have his or her ballot? If YES, spoil the ballot and issue a new one. The voter CAN vote on the machine. If NO, the voter CANNOT vote on the machine. The voter will become provisional.	ISSUED
Junior Senior	This voter may share an address with another voter of the same name. MAKE SURE YOU ARE CHECKING IN THE CORRECT PERSON.	พิล
Marked	A ballot was received from the voter. The voter CANNOT vote on the machine. If voter persist issue provisional.	STOP
Marked for Address Confirma	If they have not moved, voter must complete Affirmation of Eligibility, after completion, voter CAN vote on the machine. If they have moved, refer to What Ifs.	?
On Machine	The voter voted early in-person. The voter CANNOT vote on the machine. If voter persist issue provisional.	STOP




EPB OFFICER/BALLOT OFFICER

- When you hand the voter a ballot tell them the following:
 - "Be sure to read both sides of your ballot."
- Hand each voter their ballot in a Privacy Folder.



Booth Officer





Booth Officer

- Manage line (with tape)
- Send voter to next available marking station
- Answer questions (cannot interpret/explain ballot questions)
- Give privacy
- Observe
- Send voters to Chief for replacement ballot if needed
- Ensure voters don't leave anything behind



Scan Officer















Scan Officer

- Manage line (with tape)
- Let voter proceed to either Scan when one is available
- Remind every voter to look for the American Flag
- Keep an eye on power indicators
- Observe voters (know your Machine Screens and Error Messages)
- Send voters to Chief for replacement ballots










Undervotes and Overvotes

Under Voting is when the voter has not selected all the choices on their ballot. They are not required to vote for all offices or issues on the ballot and so the machine will take the ballot.

Over Voting is when the voter has selected more choices on one office or ballot issue than allowed. A common error is to vote for the candidate of their choice and then write in the name – the computer cannot tell the difference. The machine will reject the ballot.



If requested, we can assist voters who ask for help before they cast their ballot on the scanner.



Scanner rejected the ballot?

1. Voter will have another opportunity to correct their ballot:

IF THE BALLOT IS NOT MARKED the machine will reject the ballot and voter will be allowed to correct the ballot or cast **AS-IS**

If voter **OVER VOTED** the ballot the machine will reject the ballot and voter will be allowed to get a new ballot or cast **AS-IS**



2. Voter will not have an opportunity to correct their ballot if they UNDER VOTED: The machine will take under voted ballots.

Stickers

 Keep "I voted" stickers on table near exit door

 Collect pens, clipboards, and privacy folders in box near door
